



Young Sherlock




December 8th and 9th 7:00 pm in the Hilltop Auditorium

When I first met Daniel, I don't think he had ever been to a weight lifting gym before. He struggled with the sport interval cycle on level 5 and almost dropped a dumbbell on his face. The next couple of days after, he texted me complaining of sore muscles. I thought to myself, "I'll never get this guy to the gym again!" However, Daniel surprised me, when I asked him about going again, "I'm in!" he said.

Over the next several months, Daniel showed massive improvement. He started exercising on his own, got his own gym membership and started working out with various family members. His Aunt gets Daniel and Logan to walk the hill with her in town and encourages everyone to health living.

We started cycling at level 6.....then level 7....then we started flirting with level 8. Somewhere during the last 6 months, Daniel started to surpass me on some of the exercises. This past Wednesday, he did the cycle on level 10. I honestly don't know if I'll live long enough to conquer level 10. What might be even more impressive however, is Daniel leg pressing 1008lbs, and deciding to go for the Guinness Juvenile record.

The first day he took me through it, I noticed that he did it right. Slowly increasing the weight, with multiple repetitions. He left me behind at around 850lbs on his way to over 1000lbs. The next day I texted him complaining about my sore legs.

Do you have an ultimate goal? If not, get one! The effort we put in pushing for our goals is what changes us for the better. So often it's the journey that matters more than the destination. It's better to aim for the moon and miss than aim for the gutter and make it every time. The sky's the limit.

Will Daniel attain the juvenile leg press record? He has a way to go! What I can say is that Daniels efforts have transformed him. Strangers at the gym have been inspired, commenting on his gains. I have been inspired. Let your efforts transform and inspire you!

Will Daniel attain the record? I dare to believe he will! Level 10....I'm coming for you!

On November 7th, guest speaker and author **Allan Kehler** spoke a powerful presentation to our students. Mr. Kehler was an exceptional student who attended a private school and received the Athlete of the Year Award, along with a national scholarship. He also suffered from domestic violence, struggled with severe addictions and lost his best friend Justin to suicide. Mr. Kehler stressed the importance of how your past does not define your future and you too can overcome and persevere. He mentioned that many struggles in peoples lives do not align with our typical judgments and stereotypes. **77**% of people struggling with a drug addiction are employed and **99**% of people struggling with alcohol addiction are also employed. Do not judge, rather, show compassion. Be willing to open the door and listen to someone who needs to talk. **Anxiety is the most common mental illness in youth.** It is important we hear the pains of our youth so we can lead them in the direction of happy future. You have two

choices, fight or give up. If you do nothing different, nothing will change. There are a variety of ways we can all learn to cope with our pain: talking, writing, online resources, natural alternatives, audio books or seeking advice from your elders and councillors. Never be afraid be to reach out and ask for help.



Parents of Students in Grade 9

In January and June of this school year, all Grade 9 students throughout the province will write the provincial achievement tests in language arts, math, science and social studies. Results for these tests will provide Alberta Education, school administrators, teachers, parents, students, and the public with information about what students know and can do in relation to provincial standards at the end of Grade 9.

Achievement tests are based on what students have been learning. Teachers mark them before they are returned to Alberta Education. This allows the teachers to look at the performance of the students in their class and to use each student's achievement test score at 20% of their final grade.

In the fall, an *Individual Student Profile* showing your child's achievement test results will be available at the school. You child will be given the results to bring home. The profile is prepared by Alberta Education after the marking and scoring of tests has been completed and final scores are calculated; it will present your child's performance on each test in relation to provincial standards. This information may be useful in planning your child's instructional program for the coming year.

Reports that show how well Hilltop High School students did as a group in relation to provincial standards will also be available at our school in the fall.

What is FLEX?

This article pertains to FLEX Block. This should bring some clarity on this topic.

What is FLEX Block?

Preparing our students to be life-long learners is about Learning Recovery and Personal Learning Time. Often students may fall behind in a course because of an illness, a fieldtrip, etc. – Learning Recovery. Sometimes, students have difficulty with key concepts and need some extra support and practice in those areas – Personal Learning Time. While both of these currently occur here at Hilltop, they tend to take place outside of the school day making attendance difficult for students who work or catch busses. Time has been built into our year's calendar and schedule for students to attend Tutorials to achieve this within the regular day.

Approximately twice a month, students will have the period prior to lunch (period 3) for Learning Recovery and/or Personal Learning Time. This Tutorial period is supervised and students are expected to attend when they have a teacher request they do so. Parents must be contacted with the relevant information ahead of time so that they can help to support the student learning at home. Students and parents may also request the student participate in these sessions. Any students who are not referred or do not request Tutorial will have an extended lunch hour on these days, grade 9 students are required to remain on campus for the duration of block 3. Meanwhile, teachers will be working in groups (Professional Learning Communities-PLCs) to create common lessons, units and assessments as well as to analyze Hilltop's relevant data so as to continue to improve upon the education programs we provide to our students.

Where can I find the dates and times for FLEX Block?

Date and time of the FLEX Blocks can be found in our School Agenda/website/ newsletter.

What are the expectations if you have been nominated for FLEX Block?

If a student is nominated by a teacher or self- nominate and/or are nominated by a parent they are expected to attend. Attendance will be taken by teachers in their FLEX Block classes. As an administration team we will follow up with students who have been nominated for FLEX Block and do not attend.

FLEX Block is a great opportunity for students to work with staff, to have additional time to work on learning required concepts, completing assignments and developing a deeper understanding of the subject they are studying.

Generally the first two to three years following a divorce is the hardest for your child. Although every family and divorce is different, there are a few ways that as a parent, you can make your divorce easier on your child. Here are some helpful tips:

- Keep adult conflict and arguments away from the kids.

The Friends of Hilltop Fundraising Society would like to pass on some information regarding the Earn on Foods Program.

The FOH Society sells Sobeys (IGA) Gift Cards to raise money for events and/or causes the Society decides to sponsor. The program not only benefits the Society, but also the Hilltop parents that buy the cards.

We will sell the gift cards to families. The cards are loaded in \$100, \$200 or \$500 amounts. Families buy the cards from Friends of Hilltop and purchase groceries with them at Sobeys stores (Edson, Drayton Valley, Spruce Grove, St. Albert, Edmonton and Whitecourt) A \$100.00 card will buy \$100.00 in groceries; you use it like a credit card. When you buy groceries using the cars, IGA deducts the amount of groceries purchased from the balance of the card. The IGA receipt shows the balance left on the card. When the total value of the cards is used it is thrown away. How do we make money doing this? IGA sells us the gift cards at a discount. We then sell them to Hilltop families. Gift cards are sold at Hilltop High School office and Remax Realty.

As of May 2014 Sobeys has changed their discount rates effective June 1, 2014. We keep track of the amount purchased and 5% of the amount of cards purchased accumulates in each families account.

You can use the balance in your account to pay for school related expenses. We have paid school fees, pictures, sport fees, school supplies, grad fees, grad rings, grad dress and tux rentals to name a few. Expense payment forms are available at the Hilltop High School front office.

The Society makes money by charging an initial \$35.00 set up fee and then a yearly \$35.00 administration fee. The Society makes decisions on spending the raised funds at the monthly meetings. The Society also has accounts accumulating for The Community Lunchbox Program and The Humanitarian Society and we do not charge any annual fees so 100% of the money raised goes directly to the Lunchbox and Humanitarian programs.




